### **BIG Summer Pattern Fun**

This quarter, both our large format designs come straight from nature. The first, "Grape Cluster" by Terra Parma, is an elegantly framed section of a grape vine, plump with ripe fruit. We chose a palette of rich, plummy purples and deep, dense greens from our Wispy collection to make the grapes and leaves pop from the Clear textured background. A touch of Pale Amber in the ribbonlike frame provides a warmer hue to balance the tones as it defines the vignette.

Our second large pattern is "Nasturtiums" by Lisa Vogt which depicts a charming patch of happy little Nasturtiums, just barely contained in its circular frame. We chose a palette of our brightest warm variegated mixes in reds and oranges to color the petals (but feel free to use your own palette — they come in many shades). Since Lisa gave us both the surface and undersides of the leaves to work

with, we were able to create some lovely definition with darker and lighter shades of greens.

# **Project Guide**


### Zebra Border • Tray


Glass Cutting: Simple curved lines


Firing: Soft Contour




This strong border design makes the most of a mold with a strong lip.







Place the Clear 6" x 12" on top of the mold. Begin arranging the black triangles as shown, using the lip of the mold to determine the inside edge of the design. (Either build the project on top of the mold or use a Sharpie to lightly mark the inside edge on the glass.



Keep adding triangles until the border is complete. The flat side of the triangles create a visual line on either side of the mold's lip. Use Klyr-Fire or pinpoints of glue to hold pieces in place. Fire using the schedules below.

### **Materials We Used**

**Base:** 6 x 12-inch Clear Rectangle

**Glass Colors:** Black Opal

Mold: Creative Paradise #GM-45

### **Tips & Tricks**

Finding just the right triangle as you build this border is a bit like working a jigsaw puzzle. Fitting the pieces carefully together pays off in the look of the finished tray.

#### **Variations**

- Use a pale Amber base instead of the Clear for a Tiger Border.
- Try it with other molds that have a strong lip. (A drop-ring works great!)

#### **6-Segment Firing Schedule**

| Segment | Ramp<br>(°F per Hour) | Goal Temp | Hold Time<br>(Minutes) |
|---------|-----------------------|-----------|------------------------|
| 1       | 300                   | 1150      | 30                     |
| 2       | 200                   | 1370      | 20                     |
| 3       | 400                   | 1390      | 5                      |
| 4       | 9999*                 | 950       | 60                     |
| 5       | 150                   | 800       | 10                     |
| 6       | 300                   | 100       | 0                      |

### **6-Segment Slumping Schedule**

| Segment | Ramp<br>(°F per Hour) | Goal Temp | Hold Time<br>(Minutes) |
|---------|-----------------------|-----------|------------------------|
| 1       | 150                   | 300       | 15                     |
| 2       | 300                   | 1100      | 20                     |
| 3       | 150                   | 1235      | 15                     |
| 4       | 400                   | 950       | 60                     |
| 5       | 150                   | 800       | 10                     |
| 6       | 300                   | 100       | 0                      |
